Fall Green Waste Collection Begins End of November

The City of Albuquerque's Solid Waste Management Department will pick up residential Green Waste at no additional charge starting Monday, November 28 through Friday, December 9. Solid Waste customers should have their Green Waste at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the day of their regular trash collection day. The following tips will help your Solid Waste drivers collect your green waste:

- Green waste must be placed 5 feet from automated trash and recycling containers as well as any large items scheduled for pick-up
- Green waste (leaves, grass, and brush) in trash bags
- Each trash bag should not weigh more than 40 pounds
- Customers that have branches must cut them to four-foot lengths and bundle them securely
- Dirt, construction debris and materials, gravel and tree stumps WILL NOT be picked up
- Do not put green waste in your recycle bin

Green waste is processed into a rough chip mulch and is used to help prevent erosion at the Cerro Colorado Landfill.
